A few highlights from when we were working staff ... more to come in the future 1987

May – Southwest Enterprise Centre opens.

June – Early Retirement Incentive program is established – 5 employees apply.

September – New programs – Law & Security Administration, Social Service Worker, Gerontology. The Freedom of Information Act was established.

1988

April – College establishes a Multi-Year Operating Budget Equalization System.

May – Six exchange students arrive from the Technical University of Marseilles.

September – New programs – Hospitality & Tourism Management, Teacher of Adults, Power Engineering Technician, Career Planning for Women, Health Care Aide.

October – Two faculty begin a three month exchange at Jianghan University in Wuhan, China.

1989

April – two faculty from Jianghan University arrive at Lambton for a six month exchange.

September – Post Secondary enrollment increases by 10.8%. New programs – Graphics Design and Environmental Technology.

<u>1990</u>

March – First on-campus video conference held.

June – Construction starts for a 50,000 sq. ft. addition to the main building.

September – The Industrial Training Division served 4,500 students in the past year.

October – the College Resource Centre acquired the Mandarin Automated Circulation System.

<u>1991</u>

June – Tom Sosa, Deputy Minister of Skills Development addresses our graduates.

August – new additions to College open – new cafeteria, student centre, classrooms, laboratories, support services.

September – new program - Correctional Worker.

November – College celebrates 25 year Anniversary. Employees donate a commemorative Kentucky Coffee Tree planted to mark the event.

July – Ground breaking for \$4M Centre for Advanced Process Technology and Business & Industry Training.

September – Aboriginal Centre opens.

1993

June – Andy Brandt, former Sarnia Mayor and Lambton MPP, addresses graduates at convocation.
